
Mine Action Funding Trends

In 2010-2019:


Global support to mine action amounted to **\$6.6** billion

Donors provided **\$5.2 billion** in **international support** (79% of all support)

\$1.4 billion in national support to their own mine action efforts (21% of all support)

international support


